Dear Parents/Carers

I hope you have had a good Easter and I look forward to the start of a new term. I would like to take the opportunity to revisit the uniform and equipment expectations. The uniform expectations have not changed since September, however there are a number of students who are not dressing correctly.

Trousers - These should be black school trousers and not jeans or leggings.

False Eyelashes - Students should have natural and non-enhanced lashes; this includes strip lashes and semi-permanent extensions. We ask that these are removed, professionally if required, by Monday.

Jewellery - must not be worn for school. Items of jewellery which are not in line with the policy will be confiscated. If ears are already pierced, only one small, plain gold or silver-coloured stud may be worn in each ear lobe. No other body-piercing is allowed, eg. nose studs, tongue studs or other ear piercings. All studs should be removed for PE.

Hair - should not be outlandish in style or colour and no brightly dyed/multi tonal hair is permitted. Heads must not be shaved, as a guide, a number two cut is the shortest permitted and there should be no tramlines or patterns shaved into hair.

Equipment - students should bring daily, in a bag; pen and pencil, planner, charged Kindle (Yrs 7 & 8), reading book (Yrs 9, 10 and 11).

We will be enforcing the uniform and equipment policy from Monday.

If you have any questions about the guidance, please do not hesitate to contact school or refer to the attached uniform policy. If you are unsure whether a piece of uniform is acceptable, please consult school before buying. If there are any extenuating circumstances which mean you are unable to meet the uniform and equipment requirements before Monday, 25th April 2022, please contact school.

We look forward to your support in ensuring all students are treated equally and trust the guidance above makes things much clearer for everyone.
