Dear Parent/Carer,



We are writing to let you know that your child has been selected to take part in **The Scholars Programme**. This is an academic programme run by The Brilliant Club, and we hope your child enjoys the opportunity!

What is The Scholars Programme?

- Students work with a university researcher in small groups to give them an experience of what it's like to study at university. We call the researcher the students' PhD Tutor.
- Students learn beyond the curriculum; PhD tutors will share their subject knowledge and passion for learning. This will stretch and challenge students as they develop their academic skills.
- At the end of the programme, students complete a final assignment of between 1000 and 1500 words. This is marked using the university grading system and allows students to show the progress they've made.
- The date for the submission of your child's Final Assignment is Tuesday 4th June 2024.

Why has my child been selected to take part in the Scholars Programme?

Your child's teachers have identified them as having the potential to make a successful application to one of the most competitive universities. Although university may not be for everyone, The Scholars Programme aims to give children an experience of university learning to help them make an informed decision.

When will the programme begin?

The Scholars Programme will begin with an Online Launch hosted by The Brilliant Club during school hours in March before PhD tutors come into school for the Tutor Launch. The Online Launch introduces students to the programme and gives them a taste of life at university in a session co-hosted by a university partner.

The Hub and Digital Tutorials

Students and teachers will be given access to our online learning platform, the Hub. The Hub allows messages to be exchanged between students and their tutor, with a moderation system in place for safeguarding. Tutorials may also be delivered remotely. When we deliver remotely, and students are at home, we record sessions to provide safeguarding oversight. Recordings are kept for a short time to ensure there are no safeguarding or quality concerns and will then be permanently deleted.

How can I ensure my child gets the most from The Scholars Programme?

We would encourage you to speak with your child about how they find the experience and remind them about completing their assignments. Graduation Event and Parent Information Events

Students attend a Graduation Event at the end of the programme to celebrate their achievements and learn more about life as a university student. Graduation Events are for students and school staff only, so that we can utilise space at on-campus events to offer every child on the programme a place. We value the support parents and carers provide and we offer online events, in partnership with universities across the UK, to provide more information about the programme and university, and give parents and carers a chance to ask questions about progression to university.
